7. Despite the abuse she went through, did Zoe still want her birth mother? Why or why not?

8. What would it be like moving from home to home and family to family?

9. What were Zoe's triggers? How does she handle them?

10. Did Zoe expect her foster mother to stick with her? Why or why not?
